The Bill Maschke Scholar-Athlete & Burt German Memorial Service Awards

The SJISA is pleased to present this award in the memory of Bill Maschke, an outstanding scholar, swimmer and coach here in South Jersey. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a maximum of four males and four females from the senior class that are chosen by a special committee from a pool of qualified applicants whose coaches have submitted transcripts, meet sheets and other supporting documents. To be considered, an applicant must have carried a minimum cumulative 3.7 GPA (on a weighted 4.0 scale) through seven semesters of work and have participated in 80% of the team's meets during the season. The committee evaluates the criteria based on a point system approved by the general membership and the award's winners are selected out of the pool of qualifying finalists by the committee. A maximum of four runner-ups for each gender will each receive a \$100 award.

It is my great pleasure to nominate freshman, Jacob Powell, for the Angela Hallerud "Newcomer of the Year" Award offered by the South Jersey Interscholastic Swimming Association. Jacob perfectly fits the criteria of an inspiring teammate who showed tremendous growth this season.

I had the distinct honor of coaching Jacob on my Varsity Men's Swim Team during his freshman year of high school. Although Jacob is not a novice swimmer- he swam club for a few years- the high school swimming setting, at first, gave him much trepidation. When I first met Jacob on the first day of practice, he had a shy demeanor and seemed nervous- the high school swimming experience was a "bigger league" for him. It was obvious to myself and my other coaches that Jacob wanted to work hard and be a scoring member of the swim team. After the first day of practice and every swim practice after, Jacob quickly broke out of his shell, becoming the leader of his lane and making sure his teammates around him were correctly following the practice schedule. He picked up on the cues of high school swimming-lingo incredibly quickly, surpassing all expectations from myself and the other coaching staff. Jacob was always happy to swim and never complained about the practice being too hard; in fact, he was always eager to hop into the pool and start practice before any of his other teammates were ready.

His enthusiasm for swimming did not stop there, as he had the best practice attendance of all the freshmen and almost all the team. He even attended a majority of practices over the winter holiday break that were not deemed mandatory. Jacob always aimed to please myself and the coaching staff at every practice and meet and was highly motivated to improve. He continuously encouraged his teammates and friends to keep working hard-even during the hardest of practice sets.

Jacob has this attitude in the pool swimming distance and on the track for dryland practices. Because of his never-give-up attitude, he was selected to swim the 200 and 500 Free many meets during the season even though on his previous club team, he never swam distance before. He improved his time each meet, finally reaching his goal of breaking 7 minutes in the 500 free as a first time high school swimmer who had never attempted to swim distance previously.

In the classroom, Jacob has an A average in almost all of his classes. It is evident that he has a strong and diligent work ethic for whatever he does. He is one of the most pleasant athletes any of the coaches have had the pleasure to have on their team- always respectful, always eager, always "himself." His positive, happy-go-lucky attitude, and his natural leadership abilities have separated him from the rest of his peers. Therefore, I am highly honored to recommend him for this prestigious award.

The History of the All-South Jersey Teams

In 1978, the South Jersey Swimming Officials selected and honored the first All-Star team. From 1978 to 1980, only one team of honorees was named and honored by the Courier-Post. From 1981 to 1986, the paper listed both an All-Star team and a group of honorable mention swimmers. In those early days, the main criteria for choosing the team was the results from the NJSIAA's "Meet of Champions", now called the Individual State Championships.

In 1987, the paper published a first, second and third team of honorees for the first time. The main criteria remained performance at the NJSIAA meet but as the SJISA Invitational and the various conference and league championships evolved, times from those meets began to also be considered for the teams' selections.

As the number of meets increased, the SJISA voted in 1991 to select its teams solely on the basis of all electronically-timed results achieved at any championship or playoff meets. Today, the organization is proud to note that the fifty-six athletes whose performances have placed them on these pages represent every swimming league in South Jersey, making them teams truly worthy of the title "All-South Jersey".

Since Ray officiated at every level as his children progressed from Tri-County through to the US National Team, the award was instituted to honor the area's outstanding swimmers or divers from any level of competition.

Allyson Mitidieri-Washick

Cherry Hill West, Class of 2010; Indiana U. of Penn., Class of 2014

Allyson Mitidieri-Washick, a four-year varsity swimmer for the Cherry Hill West Lady Lions (2006-2010), was team captain her senior year and the team's 2010 Dr. Joan Katz Award winner.

Collegiately, Allyson swam at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. At the end of her time competing for the Crimson Hawks, she held the school records in the 100- & 200-yard breaststroke and the 200- & 400-yard IM in addition to swimming on the record-setting 200 & 400-yard medley and the 800-freestyle relay teams. The Hawks named her their MVP for the 2013 and 2014 seasons. Allyson finished her career as a nine-time All-American over three NCAA Championships (2012, 2013, 2014), a four-time PSAC conference champion, an Academic All-American, and the 2014 IUP Female Scholar Athlete of the Year. In 2014 she was named to the NCAA All-District Women's at Large Team (District 2) and to the Capital One All-American Second-Team. The John Bohanna Most Courageous Award

Catie Shawaryn

Moorestown High School

As a freshman and sophomore, Catie Shawaryn helped lead the Moorestown Quakers to second and third consecutive NJSIAA Group B State Championships. Catie was named 2nd team All-South Jersey by the SJISA in the 100 Free and was recognized as a NISCA All-American for her efforts in the 400 Free Relay her sophomore year. She was named captain this past season as a senior and leaves Moorestown holding five school records (50 Free, 100 Free, 200 Medley Relay, 200 Free Relay and 400 Free Relay).

In addition to being an accomplished swimmer, Catie is also a very talented rower and student. Catie was heavily recruited by multiple high profile NCAA Division One schools to row with an eye on one day competing in the Summer Olympics. In the classroom, Catie is currently taking 4 AP courses and will be recognized as a NISCA Academic All-American at the end of the school year.

Catie's senior season began with a great start. The team was swimming well and Catie was contributing as usual. However, at some point in January, Catie started to feel dizzy and lightheaded. She could also feel her pulse racing frequently. CONTINUED→

Concerned, Catie's parents took her to a cardiologist to seek a diagnosis. Over the course of the next week, Catie underwent various tests and was required to wear a heart monitor.

While wearing the monitor, it was discovered that Catie's heart rate was rising to dangerously high levels and she was diagnosed with Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy, an unpreventable genetic condition that causes irregular and elevated heart rates. To combat this diagnosis, Catie was required to do two things: First, she had to have an Implantable Cardioverter Defibrillator, a small device designed to combat any future heart rate irregularities, implanted into her chest. Second, she had to give up competitive swimming and rowing for the rest of her life.

The amount of resiliency Catie showed after hearing this news was inspiring and mature beyond her years. She was released from the hospital a few days after her procedure and made sure to be there for her teammates for the final moments of our season. During our playoff meet against Cherry Hill West, Catie was an encouraging and supportive teammate throughout the contest. At the Meet of Champions, a meet that Catie would have swum in one final time, she was on deck and became "Coach Catie" for the weekend. She took spits, made sure her teammates were prepared to swim their events and continued to be an inspirational influence to all of us on deck. Coach Battersby

The Swimmers of the Year

Maddie Waggoner became just the second swimmer in Moorestown High School Girls Swimming history to win an individual state championship in this year's 500 Yard Freestyle, joining Marisa Chuliver (50 and 100 Free, 1993 and 1994) on a very exclusive list. During Saturday's preliminary heat at the NJSIAA Meet of Champions, Maddie swam a meet record 4:45.27. Maddie also finished 2nd in the 200 Yard Individual Medley with a new school record of 2:01.44. Both times earned Maddie the title of NISCA All-American, her fourth and fifth such distinctions of her high school career.

Maddie also participated in the 200 Yard Medley Relay and the 400 Yard Freestyle Relay at the Meet of Champions. Both relays, based on initial seedings, were not expected to return to Sunday's Finals. However, Maddie and her teammates rose to the occasion to earn spots in Sunday's championship heats. The Medley Relay team climbed 22 spots to finish 6th in the state with a time of 1:48.59 and the 400 Free Relay team rose 18 spots to finish 8th, respectively.

In her three years with the Quakers, Maddie has made an incredible impact in and out of the pool. As a freshman, Maddie was a key contributor to the program's third consecutive NJSIAA Group B State

Championship during the 2019-20 season. During her first Meet of Champions experience, she swam the 200 Yard Individual Medley (5th) and 100 Yard Breaststroke (3rd) and contributed to the 200 Yard Medley Relay (2nd) and 400 Yard Freestyle Relay (3rd).

Out of the pool, Maddie is a carefree and enthusiastic young lady who contributes to a positive team atmosphere and culture. Maddie is a wonderful teammate who can oftentimes be seen on the deck encouraging her teammates, singing her favorite Disney tunes on the bus or discussing meet strategies with her coaches.

Maddie's ability to combine talent, an incredible drive to be the best, a team first mentality and a highly intelligent swimming IQ makes her a very special student-athlete and one that will have an impact on the Moorestown program and South Jersey swimming for years to come.

Maddie's future is certainly exciting! This summer, Maddie will represent her country as a member of the U.S. National Junior Team. Next winter, Maddie will return to Moorestown for one final high school season as a team captain before beginning her collegiate career at the University of Wisconsin.
