The Bill Maschke Scholar-Athlete Awards

The SJISA is pleased to present this award in the memory of Bill Maschke, an outstanding scholar, swimmer and coach here in South Jersey. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a maximum of four males and four females from the senior class that are chosen by a special committee from a pool of qualified applicants whose coaches have submitted transcripts, meet sheets and other supporting documents. To be considered, an applicant must have carried a minimum cumulative 3.7 GPA (on a weighted 4.0 scale) through seven semesters of work and have participated in 80% of the team's meets during the season. The committee evaluates the criteria based on a point system approved by the general membership and the award's winners are selected out of the pool of qualifying finalists by the committee. A maximum of four runner-ups for each gender will each receive a \$100 award.

The Angela Hallerud Newcomer of the Year Award

The winner each year will receive a plaque, a \$100 gift certificate to "The Sprint Lane" shop at Jersey Wahoons in Mt. Laurel and free lifeguarding certification classes courtesy of the Hallerud family.

Maggie Wallace Ocean City High School

It is with great pleasure that I nominate Maggie Wallace for the Angela Hallerud "Newcomer of the Year Award. I believe that Maggie is the perfect candidate for this award. I had the pleasure of teaching Maggie last year in 8th grade. During the season last year she would ask me everyday about who we were racing, what everyone was swimming, and how she couldn't wait to be a part of the Ocean City Girls Swim team. Before she was even in high school Maggie was already talking about how she could positively contribute to the team's successes. She came to meets to cheer on the team that she knew she was going to be a part of next year.

Even though Maggie didn't train in the pool with the girls on a daily basis she made an effort to be a part of the team culture as much as possible. Maggie trains dryland at the Ocean City Community Center in the afternoon before she goes to practice with Pleasantville aquatics at night. Before her training sessions she would come in to practice to say hello to her teammates, cheering them on during hard sets and making herself a presence on deck; she wanted to be a part of the team as much as possible, even if she wasn't training with the girls on a daily basis. She would also speak to the coaches about upcoming meets and possible events that she might swim. Even though Maggie is primarily a distance swimmer she made it evident to the coaches that she was willing to swim any event where her team needed her. With this attitude Maggie discovered that she excelled as a backstroke. She began to train as a backstroke in her club practices in order to help the team advance this year in both regular season and state playoffs; she helped lead Ocean City to its second straight Sectional title. She understood that her team needed her in other events besides the ones that she enjoyed. In this manner she put her team's needs before her own.

This positive attitude made Maggie an influential role model for her teammates. She led her team mates by example. She pushed herself and her peers to be the best they could be. I believe Maggie's constant smile, positive attitude, and willingness to work towards the team's common goals makes her an excellent candidate for the Angela Hallerud "Newcomer of the Year" Award. Her vivacious personality and ability to put others before herself will make her an indispensable member of this team for the next three years.

The History of the All-South Jersey Teams

In 1978, the South Jersey Swimming Officials selected and honored the first All-Star team. From 1978 to 1980, only one team of honorees was named and honored by the Courier-Post. From 1981 to 1986, the paper listed both an All-Star team and a group of honorable mention swimmers. In those early days, the main criteria for choosing the team was the results from the NJSIAA's "Meet of Champions", now called the Individual State Championships.

In 1987, the paper published a first, second and third team of honorees for the first time. The main criteria remained performance at the NJSIAA meet but as the SJISA Invitational and the various conference and league championships evolved, times from those meets began to also be considered for the teams' selections.

As the number of meets increased, the SJISA voted in 1991 to select its teams solely on the basis of all electronically-timed results achieved at any championship or playoff meets. Today, the organization is proud to note that the fifty-six athletes whose performances have placed them on these pages represent every swimming league in South Jersey, making them teams truly worthy of the title "All-South Jersey".

She not only won states, but she beat the old NJ state record from 1994 of 517 with a total of 566.95. Whether it is practice, or a meet, she always wants to be the first diver on the board and will stay in warm-ups until the officials close the board. But it is not just about her diving. During practices she is always willing to help other divers, give encouraging compliments, and applaud each diver. This is a true testimony to her character and sportsmanship. Steven Shek Lenape High School

Throughout his Lenape High School career, Steven Shek only lost a handful of individual and relay events, making him the winningest swimmer in Lenape history. He has rewritten almost every Lenape swimming record including relays, breaking at least one record every year and illustrating his versatility in the sport. As a sophomore, he broke the butterfly record which stood for over 36 years. This year alone, Steven broke or reset four individual records and participated in relays that reset two records and tied one.

His list of accomplishments as a high school swimmer is awe inspiring. This year alone, Steven was selected as 1st Team All South Jersey in the 100 Freestyle, 1st Team All County in the 200 IM and 100 Breaststroke, 1st Team Pacific Division All Star in the 200 and 500 Freestyle (finishing first at the Invitational in both events), and 2nd Team Pacific Division All Star in both the 200 Medley Relay and 400 Freestyle Relay (helping those relays to two second place finishes at the Invitational). Over the past two years at the Meet of Champions, Steven finished 2nd in four individual events and had three top 10s in relays. What is epic about those 2nd place finishes is that all four State Champions who beat him had to swim a meet record to do it. This is a testament to Steven's drive to be the best and his ability to make others who swim with or against him even better. And his teammates follow this lead, forcing other teams to bring their best to beat us. Our four point loss in our second straight Sectional Finals appearance was devastating but also triumphant. All 17 of our swimmers "swam like Steve," several hitting personal bests by 2 or 3 seconds. And Steven capped off his team's display of speed by breaking the Neptune Aquatic Center pool record in the 500 Freestyle, marking his place in Central Jersey swimming history.

Steven Shek graduates from Lenape in the top 10% of his class and will bring his winning ways to college swimming at the University of Notre Dame—a Division I powerhouse in the sport. He will undoubtedly be heralded for years to come as the best swimmer Lenape High School has ever seen.
