

The Bill Maschke Scholar-Athlete Awards

The SJISA is pleased to present this award in the memory of Bill Maschke, an outstanding scholar, swimmer and coach here in South Jersey. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a maximum of four males and four females from the senior class that are chosen by a special committee from a pool of qualified applicants whose coaches have submitted transcripts, meet sheets and other supporting documents. To be considered, an applicant must have carried a minimum cumulative 3.7 GPA (on a weighted 4.0 scale) through seven semesters of work and have participated in 80% of the team's meets during the season. The committee evaluates the criteria based on a point system approved by the general membership and the award's winners are selected out of the pool of qualifying finalists by the committee. A maximum of four runner-ups for each gender will each receive a \$100 award.

The History of the All-South Jersey Teams

In 1978, the South Jersey Swimming Officials selected and honored the first All-Star team. From 1978 to 1980, only one team of honorees was named and honored by the Courier-Post. From 1981 to 1986, the paper listed both an All-Star team and a group of honorable mention swimmers. In those early days, the main criteria for choosing the team was the results from the NJSIAA's "Meet of Champions", now called the Individual State Championships.

In 1987, the paper published a first, second and third team of honorees for the first time. The main criteria remained performance at the NJSIAA meet but as the SJISA Invitational and the various conference and league championships evolved, times from those meets began to also be considered for the teams' selections. As the number of meets increased, the SIISA voted in 1991 to

select its teams solely on the basis of all electronically-timed results achieved at any championship or playoff meets. Today, the organization is proud to note that the fifty-six athletes whose performances have placed them on these pages represent every swimming league in South Jersey, making them teams truly worthy of the title "All-South Jersey".

The Ray Hegel Award

This award may be presented annually by the South Jersey Swimming Officials Association in memory of Ray Hegel, one of the greatest officials to ever work in South Jersey. Since Ray officiated at every level as his children progressed from Tri-County through to the US National Team, the award was instituted to honor the area's outstanding swimmers or divers from any level of competition.

Katie Scott

Cherry Hill East, Class of 2009 Marymount University, Class of 2013

Katie Scott graduated from Cherry Hill East in 2009. Katie swam for the Old Orchard, Wexford Leas, and Jersey Wahoos swim clubs. In high school, Katie swam the 200 and 500 yard freestyles almost every meet, all four years as a cougar. In 2009, she left for Marymount University in Arlington, Virginia. During her career at Marymount, Katie maintained all conference standing in the 400 IM, 500 freestyle and the 1650 freestyle, placing in the top three each year and is still in the top ten all time standards for the university's team in those events. Upon missing out on her biggest goal of securing a slot on the record board, Katie directed her efforts toward swims outside of the pool.

After several shorter 5k swim wins throughout college, Katie made a leap from 3.1 miles to 12.5 miles around Key West. In June of 2012, Katie swam amongst 140 other swimmers to a first place female finish in the time of 5:52. The following year, she would win the swim again in the time of 5:35. It was after those two swims that Katie found that this was her niche. In October of 2013, Katie was one of only 17 to start, and 8 to finish, the 15.1 mile swim around Cape May, New Jersey. Although rough currents and six foot waves made the swim difficult for many to finish, Katie placed second amongst female professional open water athletes. The next swim on her list would be the Tampa Bay Marathon swim, a distance of 24 miles. This swim hosts swimmers from all over the world. Scott finished second female, third overall in a time of eleven hours and nineteen minutes. After Tampa, Scott began setting her sights on the triple crown which consists of the Catalina Channel, Manhattan Marathon Swim, and the English Channel. In February of 2016, Scott was added from a waitlist for a slot to swim the channel in August. Upon arriving, Katie would swim August 30th 2016 beginning at 5am. Water temperatures and currents would prove to be the biggest challenge, with several previous swimmers being evacuated due to hypothermia days before. Scott successfully crossed the channel in a time of thirteen

Alyssa White has been one of the most reliable and cheerfully efficient swim team managers I've ever had, and I am now in my 32nd year of high school coaching.

The bus took off without her! Any normal kid would have cursed me out and gone home. Not Alyssa! I heard some of the kids on the back of the bus yelling my name, but it didn't register what was happening until I looked out the back window and saw Alyssa sprinting desperately down the street AFTER the bus. I always knew she was a good athlete, and her desperate sprint down the street to catch up with the bus confirmed my suspicions. Needless to say, Alyssa has never left the bus since without double and triple checking with me first

I will miss her warm smile and her cheerful efficiency next year, but she has done an excellent job in training her replacements. She has done a great job for the Gateway/Woodbury Swim Team over the last four year, however, and is highly deserving of this award and recognition. Coach Pegues
