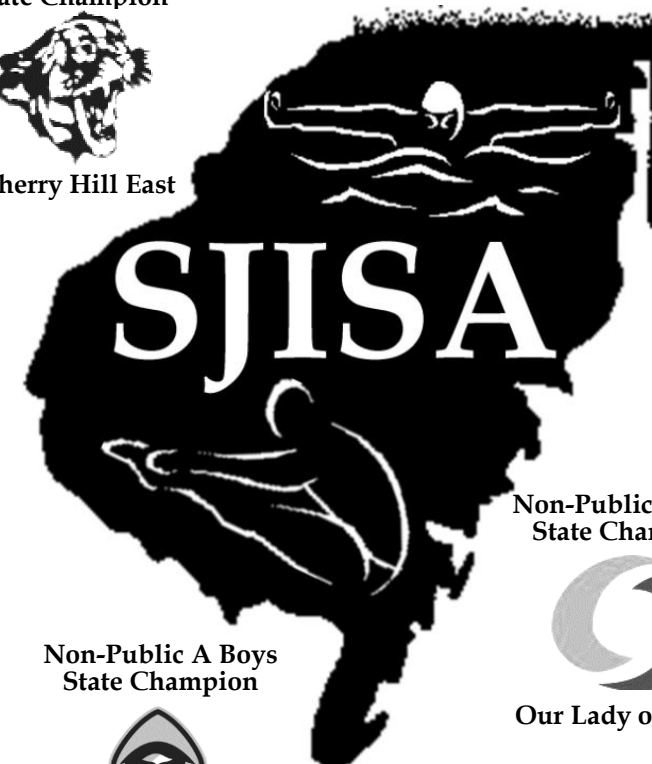

The Bill Maschke Scholar-Athlete & Burt German Memorial Service Awards

The SJISA is pleased to present this award in the memory of Bill Maschke, an outstanding scholar, swimmer and coach here in South Jersey. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a maximum of four males and four females from the senior class that are chosen by a special committee from a pool of qualified applicants whose coaches have submitted transcripts, meet sheets and other supporting documents. To be considered, an applicant must have carried a minimum cumulative 3.7 GPA (on a weighted 4.0 scale) through seven semesters of work and have participated in 80% of the team's meets during the season. The committee evaluates the criteria based on a point system approved by the general membership and the award's winners are selected out of the pool of qualifying finalists by the committee. A maximum of four runner-ups for each gender will each receive a \$100 award.

It is my great pleasure to nominate freshmen Katherine DiLorenzo for the Angela Hallerud “Newcomer of the Year” Award offered by the South Jersey Interscholastic Swimming Association. Katie perfectly fits the criteria of an inspiring teammate who will do whatever it takes to help the team succeed.

Katie is an extremely talented club swimmer. As such, she could easily have just come to the six mandated team practices and then just have come to meets. But, this was not the case. After making the six required practices, Katie attended the hour-long swim study hall almost every day and rode the bus over to GCIT with the team. She then assisted in coaching the novice swimmers in our slowest lanes, demonstrating stroke technique, or just monitoring the swimmers as needed until it was time for her GPAC practice. Because she is not quite as fast as her teammates in her favorite events, 200 IM or 100 breaststroke, she was often asked to swim some of the hardest events, 200 and 500 free. She never complained and often had to swim a leg on the A relay either before or after these long races.

If I told her we needed points or asked her to get a certain place, she would swim her hardest to do it. At the TCC showcase, for example, I asked her to try hard for second, even though she was seeded third because we needed the points to try for a team win. She exceeded expectations, not only getting second but bettering her best time by almost 3 seconds and getting a state qualifying time. She then got a brief rest and was off to swim her leg on the 200-free relay. She did this in her usual fashion with a smile and twinkle in her eye, always happy to swim for her team and with her peers.

In the classroom, Katie has an A average in almost all of her classes. It is evident she has a strong work ethic for whatever she does. She is also one of the most pleasant athletes any of the coaches had the pleasure to coach, especially since she would stay to the end of every meet and cheer for all her teammates creating a positive influence on the culture of our team. Therefore, I am highly honored to recommend her.

The History of the All-South Jersey Teams

In 1978, the South Jersey Swimming Officials selected and honored the first All-Star team. From 1978 to 1980, only one team of honorees was named and honored by the Courier-Post. From 1981 to 1986, the paper listed both an All-Star team and a group of honorable mention swimmers. In those early days, the main criteria for choosing the team was the results from the NJSIAA’s “Meet of Champions”, now called the Individual State Championships.

In 1987, the paper published a first, second and third team of honorees for the first time. The main criteria remained performance at the NJSIAA meet but as the SJISA Invitational and the various conference and league championships evolved, times from those meets began to also be considered for the teams’ selections.

As the number of meets increased, the SJISA voted in 1991 to select its teams solely on the basis of all electronically-timed results achieved at any championship or playoff meets. Today, the organization is proud to note that the fifty-six athletes whose performances have placed them on these pages represent every swimming league in South Jersey, making them teams truly worthy of the title “All-South Jersey”.

Since Ray officiated at every level as his children progressed from Tri-County through to the US National Team, the award was instituted to honor the area's outstanding swimmers or divers from any level of competition.

Kevin Gillooly

Cherry Hill East, Class of 2017; Rowan University, Class of 2022

Kevin Gillooly graduated from high school with the intentions of swimming at Rowan University for the next four years of his life. Instead, Kevin had an experience that has catapulted him into a world that was unfathomable when he graduated from Cherry Hill East. Kevin took Rowan by storm earning top honors as a student and an athlete. He was a 3-time Rowan Scholar Athlete. He was the 2018 Metropolitan Conference Rookie of the Year, the 2019, 2020, and 2022 NJAC Swimmer of the Year and the 2022 NJAC Male Athlete of the Year. Kevin's talents were celebrated on the national scale. He is an 18-time NCAA Division III All American, the 2022 Division III National Runner up in the 100 Freestyle and the 2022 Division III National Champion in the 50 Freestyle.

Kevin didn't limit his post-high school swimming career to just the collegiate level. He also competed in USA Swimming events where he was the 2019 Mid Atlantic Long Course Champion in the 50 Freestyle and was the 2021 Speedo US Summer Championships Runner up in the 50 Freestyle. Kevin's efforts were rewarded when he qualified for Wave 2 of the 2021 Olympic Trials in the 50 Freestyle, finishing 30th and being the only Division III swimmer to qualify for Wave 2 at Trials.

Kevin has extended his swimming career since graduating from Rowan in the Spring of 2022. He has moved to Laguna Beach and is swimming for the Mission Viejo Nadadores and is swimming on the pro swimming circuit. He has placed 10th in the 50 Freestyle at the 2022 FINA World Cup and finished as a finalist in the 50 Freestyle at both the 2022 Toyota US Open Championships and the 2023 TYR Pro Series. Kevin continues to raise his standards and is still striving for improvement and excellence long past high school. Congratulations to Kevin Gillooly, this year's recipient of the Ray Hegel Award for Outstanding Accomplishments in Swimming.

The John Bohanna Most Courageous Award

Spiro Yeo

Clearview Regional High School

Spiro Yeo is a 4-time Varsity letter winner for the Clearview Regional Boys Swim Team. He won the 100 butterfly this year at the Tri-County Conference Showcase and at the Gloucester County Championship Meet. He earned Tri-County Conference Royal Division 1st Team Honors in the 100 butterfly and in the Meet of Champions-qualifying 400 freestyle relay. I knew upon meeting this young man that he was a talented student-athlete. The personal adversity he faced last year highlighted his resilience and his keen ability to be introspective.

Perhaps you recall the tornadoes that swept through southern NJ in September of 2021. Spiro's family braced for their lives in their basement as tornados rolled through their neighborhood. When it was safe to withdraw from cover, his family emerged to find a home destroyed. Without an inhabitable home, the family spent the better part of the next year living with family and renting until their home could be repaired, having to commute to Clearview from a few towns over.

This occurred just a couple days before the start of Spiro's junior year. He had been ready to take an extremely challenging schedule of classes, including three AP and numerous Honors-level courses, eager to dedicate himself to his swim teams, and excited to start preparing for the college application process. Now Spiro was dealing with the physical and emotional fallout of a natural disaster. He struggled to find the balance between heading towards the goals he planned to achieve in 11th grade and giving up some of those so he could focus on his and his family's well-being. Some days were more challenging than others; Spiro was forced to recon with what is important in life and what can be let go of when times are tough. He was faced with adult-level problems and met them with adult-level maturity.

By the time we made it to swim season in November, Spiro's personal life was still very much in an upheaval, but he had begun to accept his "new normal" and could put things into perspective. On the pool deck, he was very much back to his "old self". He is an extremely talented swimmer, a fiercely intelligent student, and a lead-by-example of role model. We have always been able to count on Spiro to do what is best for the team rather than what is best for him, individually, and his presence on our team will be greatly missed.

The Swimmers of the Year Maddie Waggoner Moorestown High School

Maddie Waggoner defended her title in the 500 Yard Freestyle at this year's NJSIAA Meet of Champions making her only the second swimmer in program history to defend an individual state championship (Marisa Chuliver - 50 and 100 Free, 1994) and was the only South Jersey female swimmer to win an individual state championship for the second consecutive year. Maddie also finished 5th in the 200 Yard Freestyle with a best time of 1:50.09. Her 500 time is an automatic NISCA All-American cut while her 200 is under consideration. These would be her 6th and 7th such honors of her high school career. Maddie also participated in the 200 and 400 Yard Freestyle Relays with teammates Caitlin Barr, Jayne Mansukani and Stephanie Shawaryn. Both squads finished 8th in the state, respectively.

In her four years with The Quakers, Maddie made an incredible impact in and out of the pool. As a freshman, Maddie was a key contributor to the program's third consecutive NJSIAA Group B State Championship during the 2019-20 season. Maddie leaves MHS holding seven school records (5 individual and 2 relays) and holds the meet record in the 500 Yard Freestyle at the NJSIAA Meet of Champions.

Out of the pool, Maddie is a carefree and enthusiastic young lady who contributes to a positive team atmosphere and culture. Maddie is a wonderful teammate and captain who can oftentimes be seen on the deck encouraging her teammates, singing her favorite songs on the bus or discussing meet strategies and lineups with her coaches.

Maddie's ability to combine talent, an incredible drive to be the best, a team first mentality and a very high swimming IQ makes her a very special student-athlete and advocate for the sport that she loves. Madde will leave an impact on the Moorestown program and South Jersey swimming community for years to come.

Henry McFadden Haddonfield Memorial High School

Henry McFadden had one of the greatest swim seasons in not only Haddonfield school history but also in South Jersey swimming history. Finishing first in the 200 and 500 Freestyle events at the Meet of Champions, he broke the NJ state records in both events. Henry was also the lead off leg in both the 200 free relay and 400 free relay for Haddonfield that also took two first places at the Meet of Champions. His lead off leg times, 20.34 in the 50 free and 43.75 in the 100 free, as well as his 1:32.97 in the 200 free & 4:22.19 in the 500 free at MOCs qualified as automatic NISCA All-American time standards this year. His butterfly swim of 48.48 in the regular season also qualified as automatic NISCA All-American time standards. Finally and most impressively during the high school season Henry competed in the Pro Swim Series in Knoxville in which he won the 200 free.

Henry is graduating as the fastest male swimmer in Haddonfield Memorial High School History. Over the course of Henry's Haddonfield swimming career he broke 9 school records (6 individual, 3 relays), won 6 MOC championships (4 individuals and 2 relays) and set 2 MOC records. He is a versatile swimmer who went undefeated in his individual events and relays throughout the regular season and the Team Tournament which was a huge factor in having Haddonfield win its 3rd straight Group C state title. He is an unbelievably hard worker, a strong leader, and a supportive teammate. He has been a one of a kind athlete in the combo of his speed and his leadership. His mindset of getting it done at all cost is truly something to marvel at.

Although we will miss Henry, we can not wait to see what he does when he goes to Stanford. We couldn't be more proud of how dedicated you are and of the young adult that you are becoming. It is a great pleasure that we honor Henry McFadden as the Male Swimmer of the Year once again.
