

West girls, East boys win battle of Cherry Hill

It wouldn't be right unless at least one of their meets was decided by the final relay.

That's what fans expect when the two Cherry Hill high schools — East and West — get together for their annual double-dual swimming showdown.

This year was no exception.

The girls' meet was tied 78-78 after Allyson Mitidieri and Kaitlyn Muscat finished 1-2 in the 100-meter breaststroke, setting the stage for a winner-take-all race in the 400-freestyle relay.

The Lions' leadoff swimmer, Amy Stelmaszyk, pulled away to a lead of almost three seconds, and team-

mates Caitlyn Howard, Mitidieri and Courtney Patterson maintained the advantage to give West the race and the meet.

Cherry Hill West, ranked No. 2 by the Courier-Post, took first and third in the race for an 88-82 victory over No. 5 East.

In the boys' meet, No. 2 Cherry Hill East received two wins apiece from Joe Petrone and Mike Krohn to easily defeat No. 11 West, 97-73.

The girls' meet went just about the way Cherry Hill West coach Scott Sweeten wanted it to go.

"All we wanted was to be

up one or two or tied going into the last race," Sweeten said. "Then all we had to do was win the last race to win the meet. That was the goal, and the girls accomplished it."

It certainly helped when Stelmaszyk swam out to a nice lead.

"It was a little nervewracking standing before

the race," Patterson said. "Amy got a good lead, and the rest of us were able to hold it. We were excited about that relay all day."

Patterson was one of several West swimmers who turned in key performances. She held off the Cougars' Marlee Ehrlich to win the 200 free and did the same to Sam Sides to win the 100 free.

She was also part of the winning 200-freestyle relay with Muscat, Stelmaszyk and Kathleen McGlinn. The Lions finished first and third in the race after the Cougars' Ehrlich and Michelle Faykes had gone 1-2 in the 500 free. That effort cut the Cougars' lead from eight points to two.

"We were not supposed to go 1-3 in that race," Mitidieri said. "That was really key there."

After the 200-free relay, Jaimie Brookover won the 100 backstroke, and the Cherry Hill East lead was back up to four, 72-68.

But then Mitidieri and Muscat fin-

ished 1-2 in the breaststroke, setting the stage for the exciting finish.

"I think we all swam really well tonight," Mitidieri said. "In fact, we probably swam a lot better than we were hoping to."

While it lacked the suspense of the girls' meet, the boys' meet produced some outstanding performances.

Petrone, swimming in this rivalry for the first time, won the 200- and 500-free events for the Cougars.
